Each module is divided into sections. Each section represents a major theme or topic within the module. The number of sections varies from module to module. Within each section, there are several lessons. Each lesson is designed to take about as long as a class period at school, which can vary from about 50 to 80 minutes. We recommend that you try to complete one lesson per day and one section per week. However, you may choose to complete lessons at a different pace, depending on your circumstances.

Section Assignments represent the formal (marked) part of each section. These assignments are where you demonstrate to your teacher just how much you've learned in the lessons. You may be instructed to complete part of a section assignment after you complete a lesson. You will complete other parts of the section assignment after you've finished all the lessons in the section. Follow the instructions carefully and do your best! If you're not sure how to answer a question, re-read the lesson or contact your teacher for assistance.

How do I keep track of my progress?

At the time of your enrollment, you will be provided with a link to Jupiter Grades which is an online grading website. As you submit work, it will be marked, and the results will be recorded in your Jupiter Grades. You, or your parent or guardian, can check your Jupiter Grades at any time to check your progress. It is recommended that you use your Jupiter Grades to devise a plan for completion of your course and then stick to the plan or better it.
